Paper related activity #2: Establishing an Annotated Bibliography

Task

Create an **annotated bibliography** of at least 10 resources that you will be able to draw on as you write your semiotically oriented paper on a topic of your choice.

Notes:

- 1. Please number your entries, and order them alphabetically by the last name of one of the authors, generally speaking that will be the "first" author. Furthermore, for each entry, please place the last name of the key author in bold font.
- 2. For each entry, please construct a "text" which contains just 4 items of information: (1) The title for the resource, or something like it, (2) the author(s) of the resource, or the closest thing that you can come come up with that relates to authorship, (3) relevant "publishing information" on the resource, or the best you can do in that regard, and (4) a date pertaining to publication of the resource, and a word about what the date means if it is not an actual date of publication.
- 3. Please format the resource identification texts as follows: (T) ... (A) ... (P) ... (D) ..., where you can use any reasonable formatting style that you like for titles, authors, publishing information, and the date.
- 4. The annotation accompanying the resource identification text should be 30-100 words, should briefly describe the resource, and should address, in very abstract terms, how you think that bits of the resource might find their way into your paper.
- 5. Please do your best to select respectable sources, even if they are not from peer reviewed journals, even if they are not classic texts.
- 6. Please select some resources that pertain to your topic of choice, and please select some semiotic resources.
- 7. Please bear in mind that when you actually write your paper, it will be required that you actually reference all of the resources in your annotated bibliography. (If you would like to keep a list of resources that you may or may not use, please just keep that list separate from this one.)
